

**Surrey County Indoor Bowling Association**  
**Result of Friendly match v Berkshire on Wednesday 18th February 2026 played**  
**at Egham Indoor Bowling Club**

Surrey won on 5 rinks, lost on 1 rink & won overall 119 – 76. After 9 ends across the 6 rinks Surrey led 48 – 45 & were 28 shots ahead (90 – 62) on ends 15. They outscored Berkshire 29 – 14 over the last 3 ends to win by 43 shots.

In the equivalent game in 2025 Surrey won 156 – 73. They won on all 6 rinks.

Since records have been kept (2017/18) Surrey have played Berkshire in friendly matches 8 times & won all these games.

After the match the President, Andrew Vernoum, presented John Barnard (Mole Valley) with his SCIBA Badge. He qualified by reaching the Area Final of the Over 60's Fours Competition.
